MINUTES CERRO GORDO COUNTY PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION

Jon & Carol Caspers - Change of Zone from A-1 to A-2 - Parcel B - Lt 4, Pleasant Valley Township

This request is on Parcel B which contains 0.47 acres. The Caspers recently exchanged Parcel C for Parcel B from the Moeller's who own the hog facility immediately to the east at 11815 130th Street.

Parcel B is less than 10 acres in size. There are no structures on Parcel B. It is covered by grass and trees and will be used as part of Caspers building site.

Arthur stated Parcel B will square up Caspers building site and the Moeller's will still have access into Parcel C. The intended uses of the parcels will not be changed.

No correspondence was received. The request is in compliance with the Comprehensive Plan. It is an existing building site; no ag land will be taken out of production and there are no access issues.

Motion by Bultje to recommend the zone change from A-1 to A-2 to the Board of Supervisors for approval with the condition that Parcel B is combined with the existing acreage. Second by Eighmey. Ayes: Eighmey, Marquardt, Bultje, Jones Abstain: Caspers

Jeff & Anna Moellers Change of Zone from A-2 to A-1 - Parcel C - Lt 3, Pieasant Valley Township

This request is on Parcel C which contains 0.47 acres. The Moeller's recently exchanged Parcel B for Parcel C from the Caspers who own the acreage immediately to the west at 11677 130th Street.

Parcel C is less than 10 acres in size but will be combined with the applicant's hog site which is zoned A-1. There are no structures on Parcel C and is currently in agricultural production. It may continue to be used as tillable ground or will be used as part of the Moeller's hog site operation.

No correspondence was received. The request is in compliance with the Comprehensive Plan. There are no access issues.

Motion by Bultje to recommend the zone change from A-2 to A-1 to the Board of Supervisors for approval with the condition that Parcel C is combined with the hog facility site. Second by Eighmey. Ayes: Eighmey, Marquardt, Bultje, Jones Abstain: Caspers

Jeff & Kara Rooney - Change of Zone from A-1 to A-2 - Section 25, Dougherty Township

This request is on a 5.04-acre parcel just west of the Floyd County line. The parcel is an existing farmstead with an existing house and many farm structures. The survey shows several non-conformities with A-2 district setbacks.

The entire NE¼ of Section 25 is farmed continuously and is owned by Mr. Rooney.

Rooney stated he would like to section off the building site and sell the acreage.


No correspondence was received. The request is in compliance with the Comprehensive Plan. It is an existing building site; no ag land will be taken out of production and there are no access issues.






Moeller/Casper Land Exchange

Manure Management Plan for Christensen Farms (Site F-42)

This report is to make you aware of concerns regarding a Manure Management Plan Update received by this office from Christensen Farms (Site F-42) swine operation. This report is being submitted according to Resolution 2003-123 A Resolution Adopting Policy for the Receipt, Review and Comment on Manure Management Plans Received by the Cerro Gordo County Board of Supervisors. Within seven (7) days of receipt of the manure management plan the Environmental Health Service Manager shall review the Manure Management Plan and prepare a report to the Board of Supervisors detailing the issues to forward to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources.

The confinement unit is located at 11414 160th Street in Section 35 of Mount Vernon Township in Cerro Gordo County. The operation houses 4,160 head of swine over fifty-five pounds. The hogs will produce 1,310,400 gallons of manure annually. The previous plan had six fields totaling 491.53 acres. The new full plan includes nine fields totaling 590.35 acres. The fields are in Sections 24, 28, 34, and 35 of Mount Vernon Township and Sections 12 and 14 of Pleasant Valley Township. My concerns are listed below:

- Beaverdam Creek and its flood plain intersect the manure application area in Section 12 of Pleasant Valley Township.
- West Branch Beaverdam Creek and a tributary border and cross the field in Section 14 of Pleasant Valley Township
- A grassy waterway cuts through the field in Section 24 of Mount Vernon Township.
- Cerro Gordo Conservation Prairie Land Trail is adjacent to the application area in Section 34 of Mount Vernon Township.
- The Walch Wildlife Area is about one mile, Zirbel Slough Wildlife Area is about 1½ miles, and Stille Wildlife Area is about one mile from the manure application area.
- The city of Swaledale is about one mile from the manure application area.
- The unincorporated village of Burchinal is about two miles from the manure application area.
- There is a discrepancy between the maps and the Year-by-Year Management Plan Summary related to the field in Section 27 of Mount Vernon Township.

Proclamation for Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month January 2025

WHEREAS, every business, community organization, faith community, family and individual can make a difference by choosing products that are not made by forced labor; by working to protect our young people from sexual exploitation; by addressing the problem of internet trafficking and pornography; and by becoming more aware of the problem and possible solutions; and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CERRO GORDO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HEREBY PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF JANUARY 2025 AS SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING PREVENTION MONTH AND ENCOURAGE ALL OF OUR CITIZENS TO BECOME MORE INFORMED ON THIS GROWING PROBLEM, TO BE VIGILANT AND REPORT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY, AND TO WORK TOWARDS SOLUTIONS TO END TRAFFICKING IN ALL ITS FORMS IN OUR COMMUNITY.
